## Attractions: Why Kofun (tomb) is special

- Take a great panoramic picture with Kofun in the background!
- **2**Enjoy the landscape viewed from the top! Can you see the stone burial chamber?
- If you look carefully enough, you will discover something quite surprising.
- **Explore the forest surrounding the Kofun!**

Yokose Kofun (tomb) is a keyhole-shaped Kofun built 1,600 to 1,550 years ago. The mound is estimated to be 137 meters long and is the second largest mound of this kind in Kagoshima Prefecture after Tojin-Otsuka Kofun located in Higashikushira Town. Yokose Kofun is located on a sand dune which expands from north to south.

Although completely buried in its current form, this Kofun mound was once surrounded by double moats. In 1902, the mound was robbed. According to the testimony of the grave robber, the inside of the stone burial chamber was painted in a vermillion color, and swords, armor and comma-shaped beads were observed there. It is believed that many fragments of haniwa clay pieces were once scattered outside the Kofun.
